Lincoln was the first American president to become officially involved in questions of Jewish equality when he urged Congress to change the chaplaincy laws to permit rabbis to become military chaplains. In January 1863, he revoked the only incident of official anti-Jewish discrimination when he countermanded General Ulysses S. Grant's infamous Order No. 11, which expelled Jews from Northern Mississippi, Tennessee, and Kentucky. Lincoln also appointed seven Jewish generals to the Union forces.
