
Thursdays January 4, 11, and 18, 7:30 pm



We will again be collecting new linens to donate to the Domestic Violence shelters operated by Jewish Family Service. Call Sheilah Hart at (818) 884-2342.




Sunday, January 28 at 2:00 pm
